



Unprepared Line Marking

Differences in warehouse and distribution facilities and their budgets, often dictate the level of work allowed prior to applying a floor marking system, which is why unprepared methods are more appropriate than other more durable options.

Unprepared line marking is the practice of applying a paint system to a concrete surface without prior work to improve adhesion. Unfortunately, the performance of this type of floor marking is limited, though it is still popular none the less. As it is less durable, it can be altered or made more hard-wearing later once the layout and operational flow of the facility is decided upon.

As with all of our methods of floor marking, we select the most appropriate paint system for your facility and traffic needs, we only use the very best available. Even though this method of floor marking is called 'unprepared' we do require the concrete surface to be free from dirt, dust and debris before applying the paint. We may need to use a scrubber dryer, solvent and/or other material to help make it as tough as we can for you, but this is an additional item to be charged for.

Two paint application methods are possible with this, which are sprayed and rolled. Where possible, we would recommend sprayed to help reduce time needed and therefore cost.
